Dear Chairman Peterson and Ranking Member Goodlatte:

We write today to urge you to hold a hearing on agriculture's role in climate change legislation. As you know, the U.S. Senate intends to debate *S. 2191, America's Climate Security Act of 2007* in June and the U.S. House is in the process of crafting climate change legislation.

Agriculture can play a significant role in helping the United States address climate change through storing carbon on agricultural lands, as well as capturing greenhouse gases on livestock facilities. The extent of benefits to agriculture hinge upon the legislative details to be resolved surrounding a cap-and-trade system, mitigation requirements and the functioning of relative credit markets.

Agriculture provides one of the only readily available and easily deployable means of achieving near-term greenhouse gas emission offsets on a significant scale. The United States Department of Agriculture and the United States Environmental Protection Agency estimate agricultural soils have the potential to sequester enough carbon to offset 20 percent of the United States annual emissions.

Specifically, we urge the House Agriculture Committee to look at how best to craft a carbon sequestration offset program to maximize agriculture's participation, the potential impact of a mandatory program on agricultural inputs, and the benefits to agriculture.

We appreciate your consideration of this request and look forward to working with you on these issues.
