SHED is very thirsty. Help SHED, the water superhero, get through the maze to the glass of water.

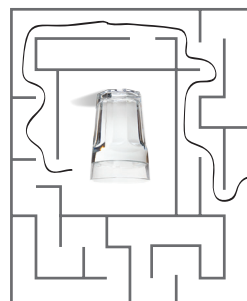

How Does WATER SHED?



A grasshopper or snake **sheds** its skin as it grows.
If you fall and skin your knee, you might **shed** a tear.
Some dogs and cats **shed** their fur.
A tree can **shed** its leaves.



A watershed is land that **sheds** water.
Water from rain or snow can flow over the land it falls on. The land **sheds** the water.
Water can also soak into the soil and flow under the land. The water can flow to a river, lake, stream or ocean.
