- Started \$500 seed money from landlord
- Boosted OARDC/OSU Extension
 - Extras to Western Reserve Land Conservancy, Ben Franklin Community Garden, and Beachwood stabilization project.

 - Brambles, Elders, Buckeyes, Serviceberries, Witch hazel...
 - Current: Sunchokes, Goldenrod, New England Asters
 - Maintenance agreements
