## Historically Underserved Farmer-to-Farmer Outreach Grants

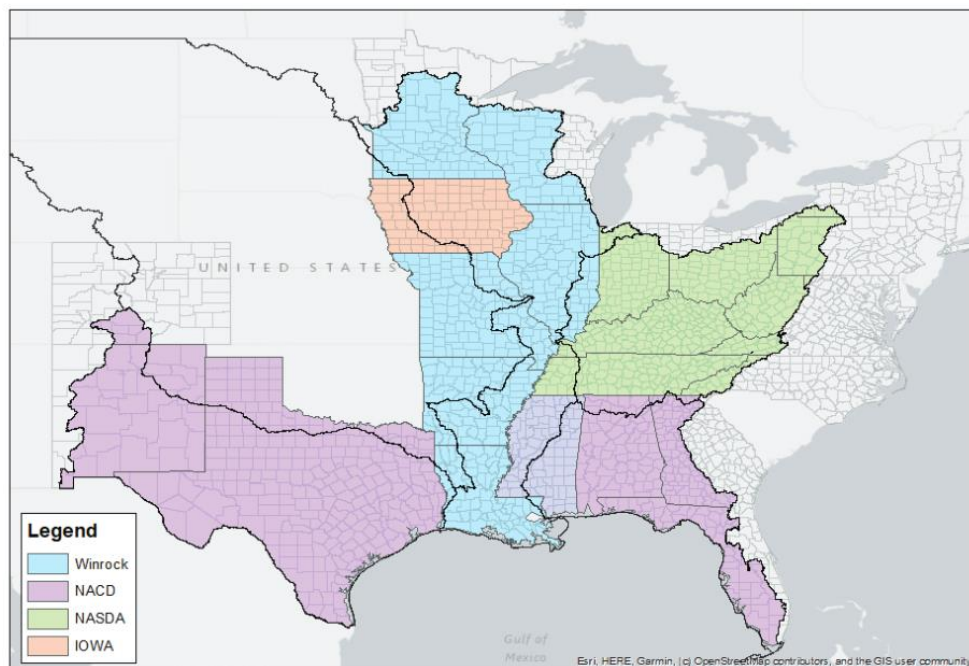
### SECTION 1: PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

#### 1.1 BACKGROUND

Within the Gulf of Mexico, excess nutrients entering via the Mississippi river watershed have resulted in a large hypoxic zone. In addition to the problems associated with low dissolved oxygen, excess nutrients can cause harmful algal blooms (HAB) that can result in a decrease in aquatic life, disrupt wildlife, and produce toxins harmful to humans. Producers are often the first line of action in reducing nonpoint source pollution of nutrients across the agricultural landscape. They have developed innovative practices, leadership models, and share their knowledge with others.

The National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) is soliciting proposals that provide for Native American and historically underserved farmer to farmer outreach and on-the-ground projects that mitigate hypoxic conditions in the Gulf of Mexico. Projects must be located in TX, MS, AL, and portions of FL, GA, NM, and CO that are in the Gulf of Mexico watershed (see map below and Appendix A).

NACD is one of four partners administering competitive grant programs on behalf of the EPA. Our other partners, the Wallace Center at Winrock International (Winrock), the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture (NASDA) Foundation, and Iowa Department of Natural Resources, will administer competitive grant programs in other HUCs within the Gulf of Mexico watershed. ## 1.2 OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this grant program are to:

- Work directly with Native American and/or historically underserved producers on novel or innovative techniques, methods, or approaches that reduce non-point source pollution and increase the sustainability and resiliency of their operations
- Leverage partnerships to increase knowledge sharing and collaboration within and among communities, producers, and partners
- Collect and analyze data to demonstrate the results of funded projects
- Disseminate results to the community to inform future conservation or management practices and expand adoption of the most cost-effective and sustainable approaches

## SECTION 2: GRANT INFORMATION

### 2.1 NACD POINTS OF CONTACT

### 2.2 AVAILABLE FUNDING

NACD expects to award up to \$2.7 million (approximately 10-36 grants ranging between \$75,000 to \$250,000).

### 2.3 ANTICIPATED PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

NACD expects to select and notify successful awardees late summer or early fall of 2023. Projects must be completed by September 30, 2027.

### 2.4 ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Applications may be submitted by one of the following entities:

- Conservation Districts
- Conservation Districts' respective state associations or state agencies (e.g., State Departments of Natural Resources, State Departments of Agriculture), so long as a Conservation District is engaged at the local level
- Resource Conservation & Development Councils
- Indian Tribal governments or intertribal consortia
  - Note: This includes Federally Recognized Indian Tribal Governments and State Designated Indian Tribes. Intertribal Consortia must meet the definition for eligibility in the Environmental Program Grants for Tribe Final Rule (40 CFR 35.504, 66 FR 3782, January 16, 2001 (FRL-6929-5)) and be a non-profit organization within the meaning of 2CFR 200.

Developing local partnerships and strengthening collaborations are priorities for this program. NACD strongly encourages local partnerships with producer groups, minority serving institutions (e.g., Historically Black Colleges and Universities, Tribal Colleges and Universities, Hispanic Serving Institutions, Asian American and Native Hawaii/Pacific Islander Serving Institutions, and Predominantly Black Institutions) and other institutions of higher learning, and non-profits (e.g., 501(c)(3)).

See Section 4 to learn how partnerships are evaluated. Interested parties are encouraged to work with their local conservation district or another eligible applicant to scope partnerships, strategies for outreach, and projects with on-the-ground outcomes.

## 2.5 ELIGIBLE GEOGRAPHIES

Eligible geographies include HUCs 12, 13, and a portion of 03. These areas are contained within the states of CO, NM, TX, AL, MS, GA, and FL. The full list of counties can be found in Appendix A.

Special Note for MS: Both Winrock and NACD will be awarding grants for successful applications in MS. Eligible entities for NACD grants are described in Section 2.4 above. ## 2.6 ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES

Awardees must work directly with Native American and/or historically underserved producers. The definition for historically underserved producers can be found at USDA's website: <https://www.nrcs.usda.gov/getting-assistance/underserved-farmers-ranchers>.

Projects must include at least one of the following types of activities:

- Water quality initiatives such as nutrient reduction with creative runoff treatment solutions; innovative year-round ground cover to limit erosion; planting field buffers; transition to low or no-till operations; managing livestock access to streams; address key manure nutrient management issues (e.g., phosphorus saturation in soil, ammonia emissions, alternative uses for manure nutrients); increase the implementation of nitrogen-use efficiency tools to better manage inorganic nitrogen inputs on cropland.
- Habitat restoration initiatives such as riparian zone improvement; observing environmental windows; restoration or protection of wildlife corridors; partner easements; landowner habitat planting/restoration; other innovative habitat ideas; conservation and restoration of perennially flooded grasslands and forests.
- Sustainable forest management initiatives such as utilizing sustainable forestry practices that protect and maintain water quality and habitat; improving utilization of sustainable forestry practices through training, education, and public outreach; and monitoring effectiveness of sustainable practices

Projects must include both of the following:

- Collaboration. Examples include: partner organizations replicating existing successes in watersheds to build stakeholder and farmer capacity through technical trainings and outreach, including awards to local farmer organizations to demonstrate techniques; working with farmer-led organizations or consortiums to reach out to small farms that are having financial, technological or other challenges in adopting nutrient reduction practices and develop creative solutions to overcoming those barriers; working with farming communities to stand up a farmer-led organization that provides technical assistance to farmers.
- Sustainable and resilient agricultural operations. Examples include: identifying vulnerabilities to climate-related risks including understanding potential exposures (e.g., weather variability such as drought, flooding, etc.); exploring the social, economic, cultural, and technical implementation challenges and opportunities for making fundamental changes to the way we farm in the watershed to ensure the long-term sustainability of agriculture; developing adaptive capacity or resilience to

respond, recover and transform continued operations after exposure that will result in reduced soil nutrient losses and improved downstream water quality.

## 2.7 USE OF FUNDS

Funding may be used to conduct outreach, provide technical assistance, implement projects, and disseminate results/best practices to a broader audience. It may also be used to provide financial assistance, cost-share to landowners, and/or direct payments to implementation partners for on-the-ground outcomes.

Grants may fund demonstration projects, which are defined as new or experimental technologies, methods, or approaches. Results must be disseminated so that others can benefit from the knowledge gained via the demonstration project. However, applicants are advised to avoid duplication of effort with projects funded via other federal (e.g., NRCS Conservation Innovation Grants (CIG)) or non-federal partners (e.g., other EPA Gulf of Mexico Farmer to Farmer Outreach awardees).

The following are ineligible activities:

- Projects that do not comply with Clean Water Act Section 104(b)(3), which authorizes the award of assistance agreements to conduct and promote the coordination and acceleration of research, investigations, experiments, training, demonstrations, surveys and studies relating to the causes, effects, extent, prevention, reduction, and elimination of pollution.
- Actions required to settle a formal enforcement action or included in a court order; or specified as a required mitigation measure under a state, local, or federal permit for a specific project; however, grant funding may be used to enhance or expand such projects beyond minimum requirements for compliance.
- Work involving only routine maintenance of storm water infrastructure and other facilities
- Projects which fall under the existing planning responsibilities of an individual state or local government (e.g., development of TMDLs or MS4 permits)
- Solely “gray infrastructure” projects (e.g., installation of sewer lines)
- Construction activities that are not a part of a demonstration project. This includes, but is not limited to, preliminary planning to determine the economic and engineering feasibility of a facility; engineering, architectural, legal, fiscal, and economic investigations and studies; surveys, designs, plans, working drawings, specifications, procedures, and other actions necessary to the construction of a facility; the erection, acquisition, alteration, remodeling, improvement, or extension of a facility; and the inspection and supervision of the construction of a facility.

Additionally, the following items cannot be purchased under the potential resultant grants:

- Any purchases or activities deemed unnecessary to accomplish grant purposes as determined by NACD or EPA, including any grantee expenses that are not directly linked to the implementation of the proposed activities
- Private ceremonies, parties, celebrations or related expenses
- Previous obligations and/or bad debts
- Expenses related to overtly religious purposes

- Expenses intended to influence the outcome of elections or other political processes
- Fines and/or penalties
- Creation of endowments
- Alcoholic beverages
- Real property (land, including land improvements, and structures thereto)
- Leases
- [Accountable personal property](#), including capitalized and sensitive personal property

## 2.8 ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY

### 2.8.1 Match

Match or leverage that accelerates the project or maximizes EPA’s investments is not required, but will be considered during the evaluation process. These additional contributions are defined below and will be evaluated in accordance with the procedures set forth in Section 4.2 of this RFA.

- Match: Non-federal contributions (may be supplied as cash or in-kind)
- Leverage: Another source of federal funding that is used to advance project goals.

## SECTION 3: APPLICATION PROCESS

### 3.1 ANTICIPATED MILESTONES & TIMELINES

Eligible entities must submit their applications using the links above by the deadline. Upon successful completion of the application, applicants will automatically receive an email confirmation with a PDF of the application attached.

### 3.2 APPLICATION PHASES

This program has two key phases: a pre-application and formal RFA/award phase.

#### 3.2.1 Pre-Application Phase

The pre-application phase is an abbreviated application that includes a project description, major milestones/timelines, outreach plans and project benefits to Native American and/or historically underserved producers, anticipated environmental results (outputs and outcomes), and an estimated budget. The pre-proposal template and instructions are provided via Appendix B, but please note that submission must be via the link provided in Section 3.1.

This phase allows NACD to understand the demand for this grant program and facilitate a match-making process that encourages new or strengthened partnerships. NACD will circulate pre-applications to various partners with the goals of:

- Identifying potential opportunities for co-investments or match
- Supporting local partnerships and outreach by marketing potential projects

Requirements for Submission of Pre-Applications:

- Pre-applications must be submitted by an eligible entity. However, potential partners are strongly encouraged to reach out to their local conservation district or one of the entities listed above to co-develop projects and pre-applications.
- Pre-Applications must be submitted using the online form. Please contact Chloe Hundelt at [chloe-hundelt@nacdnet.org](mailto:chloe-hundelt@nacdnet.org) if you are having trouble accessing the application.
- Eligible entities must submit a pre-application in order to submit a final proposal.
- Pre-proposals will not be formally evaluated (e.g., rated, ranked, or scored); however, NACD will review pre-applications for completeness and to ensure they do not include ineligible activities. NACD also reserves the right to provide feedback to applicants, with the goals of strengthening proposed projects or maximizing budgets.
- Eligible entities are not required to accept offers or project recommendations from potential partners. Acceptance/rejection will not impact the final evaluation, although the overall strength of local partnerships and collaborations will be evaluated.
- NACD will not accept late submissions.

#### 3.2.2 Final Applications

Final applications will build upon the pre-proposal phase with additional detail and budget refinements. The final application template and instructions are provided via Appendix B, but please note that submission must be via the link provided in Section 3.1. NACD reserves the right to amend this RFA and update the templates. Applicants will be notified of any amendments to the RFA or timelines.

NACD will not accept late final applications or revisions after the due date. Incomplete applications may have a negative impact on evaluation and scoring. Applications must be submitted using the online form. ### **3.2.3 Environmental Results**

Applicants are required to describe and quantify anticipated environmental results, which includes both outputs and outcomes. For the purposes of this RFA, NACD will be assessing technical and social environmental results. These are described in further detail in the following section.

EPA Order 5700.7A1 describes its policy for addressing environmental results. This order ensures that EPA assistance agreements (such as this grant) are results oriented, aligned with the agency's strategic goals, and demonstrate achievement of environmental results. #### **3.2.3.1 Outputs**

Environmental outputs (or deliverables) refer to an environmental activity, effort, and/or associated work product that will be produced. Outputs must be measurable and related to an environmental goal or objective.

Applicants shall list anticipated outputs in the pre-application. The final application shall include target metrics, as well as quarterly milestones that demonstrate progress towards the target.

Examples of technical outputs include, but are not limited to:

- Number of conservation, watershed, restoration, and/or land use plans developed
- Number and type of practices designed, implemented, and certified
- Number of acres and/or miles of conservation practices adopted
- Estimation of nutrient reduction, habitat improvement, and/or sustainable forests protected

Examples of social outputs include, but are not limited to:

- Number of new Native American and/or historically underserved producers reached
- Number of farmer-to-farmer education events/presentations and number of participants
- Number of new sub-watershed wide and/or regional coalitions or partnerships
- Number of producers that adopt new practices that improve on-farm resilience
- Number of producers that implement practices that reduce nutrient losses and improve water quality

#### **3.2.3.2 Outcomes**

Environmental outcomes are the results, effects, or consequences that occur from carrying out this program or activity. Outcomes may be qualitative and environmental, behavioral, health-related, or programmatic in nature, but must be quantifiable. Outcomes may be short-term (changes in learning, knowledge, attitude or skills), intermediate (changes in behavior, practice, or decisions), or long-term (changes in condition of the natural resource).

Applicants shall list anticipated outcomes in the pre-application. The final application shall include target metrics, as well as quarterly milestones that demonstrate progress towards the target. Applicants must also include an initial baseline in order to provide an accurate view of progress. If baseline metrics do not exist or are not accessible, applicants must instead take before/after project measurements to verify progress. Please specify your approach in the final proposal.

**Technical outcomes must include at least one of the following:**

- Acres and type of habitat enhanced, protected, or restored over the life of the project; or
- Improvement in at least one water quality (WQ) parameter in a water body and/or segment. This may include, but is not limited to excess nutrients, turbidity, total suspended solids, dissolved oxygen, pH, and temperature.

Examples of other technical outcomes include, but are not limited to:

- Pollutant load reductions (e.g., nutrients, sediment) in the Gulf of Mexico watershed
- # pounds of nitrogen, phosphorus, or sediment discharge avoided

Example of social outcomes include, but are not limited to:

- Improvements made to state, county, or local environmental programs, requirements, or policies to better protect public health and the environment
- Improved collective knowledge about more efficient farming practices, resulting in reduced pollution

### **3.2.3.3 Quality Assurance**

Each subawardee must have a Subaward Quality Assurance Plan (SQAP). The SQAP serves as a blueprint for collecting and validating high quality environmental data and information. Basic elements of the SQAP shall define and describe the following:

- who will use the data;
- what the project's goals/objectives/questions or issues are;
- what decision(s) will be made from the information obtained;
- how, when, and where project information will be acquired or generated;
  - Sampling process, methods, and handling (if applicable)
  - Analytical methods, including models for quantification
  - Instrument/equipment testing, inspection, maintenance (including calibration and frequency)
- what possible problems may arise and what actions can be taken to mitigate their impact on the project;
- what type, quantity, and quality of data are specified;
- how "good" those data have to be to support the decision to be made; and
- how the data will be analyzed, assessed, and reported.

NACD will hold an "umbrella" Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP) with EPA. Eligible Applicants must describe their approach to developing the SQAP in the final application. Final SQAPs must be submitted to NACD within 45 days of award. The SQAP must be approved before the subawardee initiates data collection, so clarify in your application whether an expedited timeframe is needed. NACD will work with subawardees to finalize and approve SQAPs.

## **SECTION 4: EVALUATION OF FINAL APPLICATIONS & AWARD**

### **4.1 ROLE OF NACD STAFF, NACD BOARD MEMBERS, AND EPA**

NACD staff will review pre-applications for completeness and to ensure they do not include ineligible activities. NACD board members may also circulate applications to various partners. They may also provide eligible entities feedback to strengthen an application or maximize the proposed budget.



NACD board members will be leveraged to evaluate, score, and select final applications for award. Board members may not evaluate a proposal from their respective state and/or district. Specific evaluators will be selected this spring, but will not be publicly named in order to preserve anonymity and the integrity of the competition.

An EPA representative will serve as an advisor. Their role will be to review proposals and serve as a technical subject matter expert to inform evaluations. They will not score or select applications.

## 4.2 EVALUATION CRITERIA

Applications will be evaluated based on technical impacts (45%), social impacts (45%), and cost effectiveness of the budget (10%).

### Technical Impacts (Total: 45 pts)

- Overall Approach (10 pts): The extent to which the application describes an innovative approach to improving the sustainability and resiliency of Native American and historically underserved producers' operations.
- Project Feasibility and Risk (5 pts): Based on an assessment of the anticipated outcomes, project milestones, timelines, and ability of the applicant to identify potential risks and mitigation plans.
- Environmental Results (technical outcomes/outputs) (10pts): Based on the strength and specificity of environmental outputs and outcomes (technical data). Final applications must include target metrics for each output and outcome, as well as quarterly milestones that demonstrate progress towards the target.
  - Important note on quantifying outcomes: Applicants must also submit an initial baseline measurement in order to provide an accurate view of progress. If baseline metrics do not exist by the time the final application is submitted, applicants must instead take before and after project measurements after selected for award. The specific approach must be identified in the final proposal.
- Quality Assurance & Reporting (10 pts): Based on the clarity of the proposed approach to measure, quantify, and report results in compliance with EPA's Quality Assurance requirements (see Section 3.2.3.3).
- Knowledge Transfer & Dissemination (10 pts): Based on the strength, clarity, and specificity of the plan to document lessons learned, widely communicate and disseminate project outcomes to NACD, other producers, partners and stakeholders, and the general public.

### Social Impacts (Total: 45 pts)

- Outreach Plan (15 pts): Based on the strength and specificity of the outreach plan, including the extent to which efforts will benefit Native American and/or historically underserved producers and result in a change of willingness to adopt conservation practices.
- Mitigate Barriers & Advance DEIJA (10 pts): Based on how the project mitigates barriers/challenges commonly faced by Native American and/or historically underserved producers and advances diversity, equity, inclusion, justice, and access.
- Strength of local partnerships (10 pts): Based on the strength and diversity of collaborations and partnerships to advance environmental outcomes and engage Native American and/or historically underserved producers.
- Environmental Results (social outcomes/outputs) (10 pts): Based on the strength and specificity of environmental outputs and outcomes (social data). Final applications must include target metrics for each output and outcome, as well as quarterly milestones that demonstrate progress towards the target.

- Important note on quantifying outcomes: Applicants must also submit an initial baseline measurement in order to provide an accurate view of progress. If baseline metrics do not exist by the time the final application is submitted, applicants must take before and after project measurements after selected for award. The specific approach must be identified in the final proposal.

### **Budget** (Total: 10 pts)

Applications will be evaluated based on the reasonableness, necessity, allowability of costs, and cost-effectiveness of the proposed budget. Cost-effectiveness will consider organizational overhead (e.g., indirect costs) and the ability to show that the majority of funding will directly benefit Native American and historically underserved producers and advance implementation of conservation practices that improve water quality.

### **Extra Points**

Additional match and/or leverage can result in additional evaluation points:

- < 10%: 1 point
- 10% to < 30%: 2 points
- 30% to < 50%: 3 points
- 50% to < 70%: 4 points
- 70% and above: 5 points

Additional match/leverage is calculated as a percentage of the total program value and is as calculated below:

NACD grant (\$100) + Match/Leverage (\$50) = Total Program Value (\$150)

Match = \$50/\$150 = 33.3%

## **SECTION 5: OTHER CONSIDERATIONS**

### **5.1 PARTIAL FUNDING**

NACD reserves the right to partially fund an application.

### **5.2 PREAWARD COSTS**

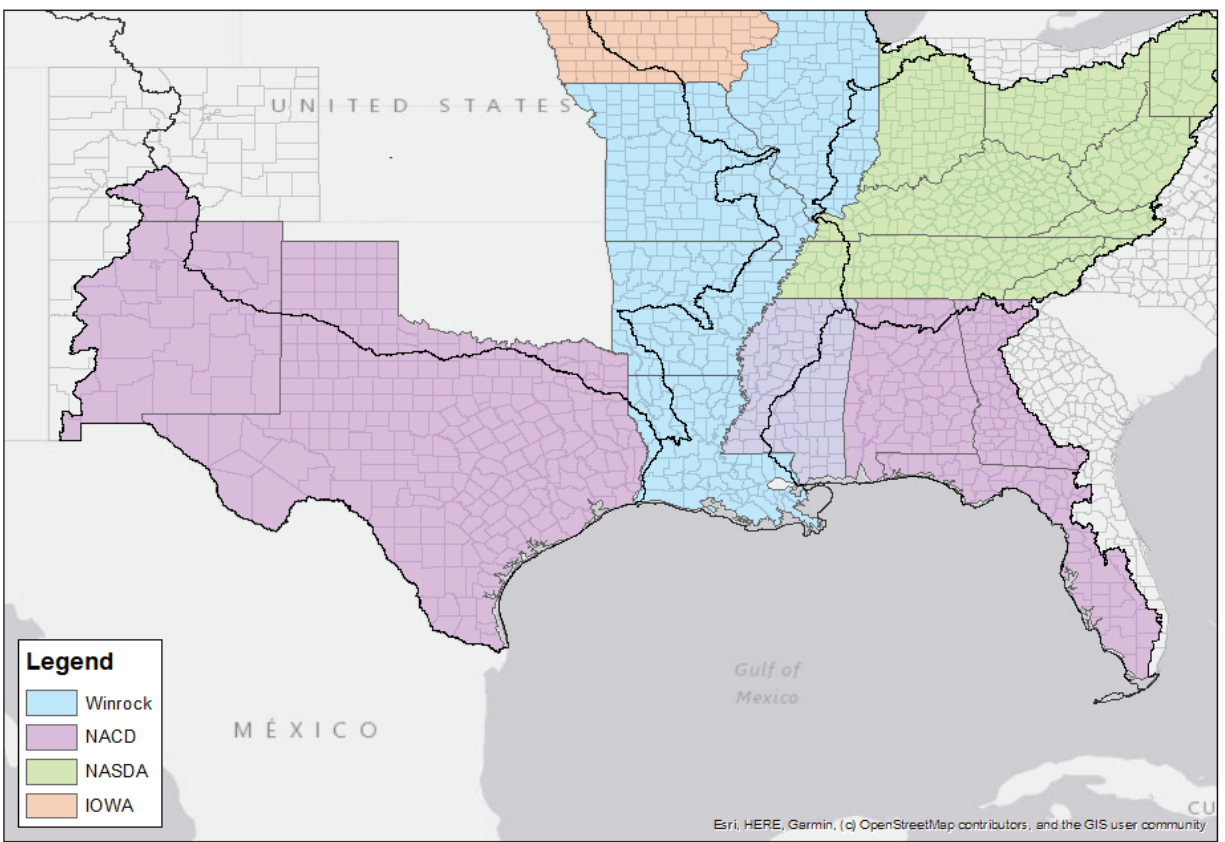
Recipients may incur eligible and allowable pre-award costs up to 90 days after selection and prior to final award at their own risk without NACD approval. Pre-award costs must comply with 2 CFR 200.458 and 2 CFR 1500.8. NACD's goal is to allow selected applicants to begin planning, outreach, marketing, etc. Costs must be within scope of and allocable to the selected project.

If for any reason NACD does not fund the application or the amount of the award is less than the applicant anticipated, then NACD is under no obligation to reimburse the applicant for these costs incurred. Thus, applicants incur pre-award costs at their own risk.

### **5.3 POST-AWARD REPORTING**

Subawardees will be responsible for quarterly reporting to NACD. At minimum, quarterly progress reports shall include a description of work accomplished (including photographs, when possible), a summary of environmental outcomes achieved compared to the targets, costs incurred, and a brief description of work anticipated during the next quarter. The final report template will be provided prior to award.

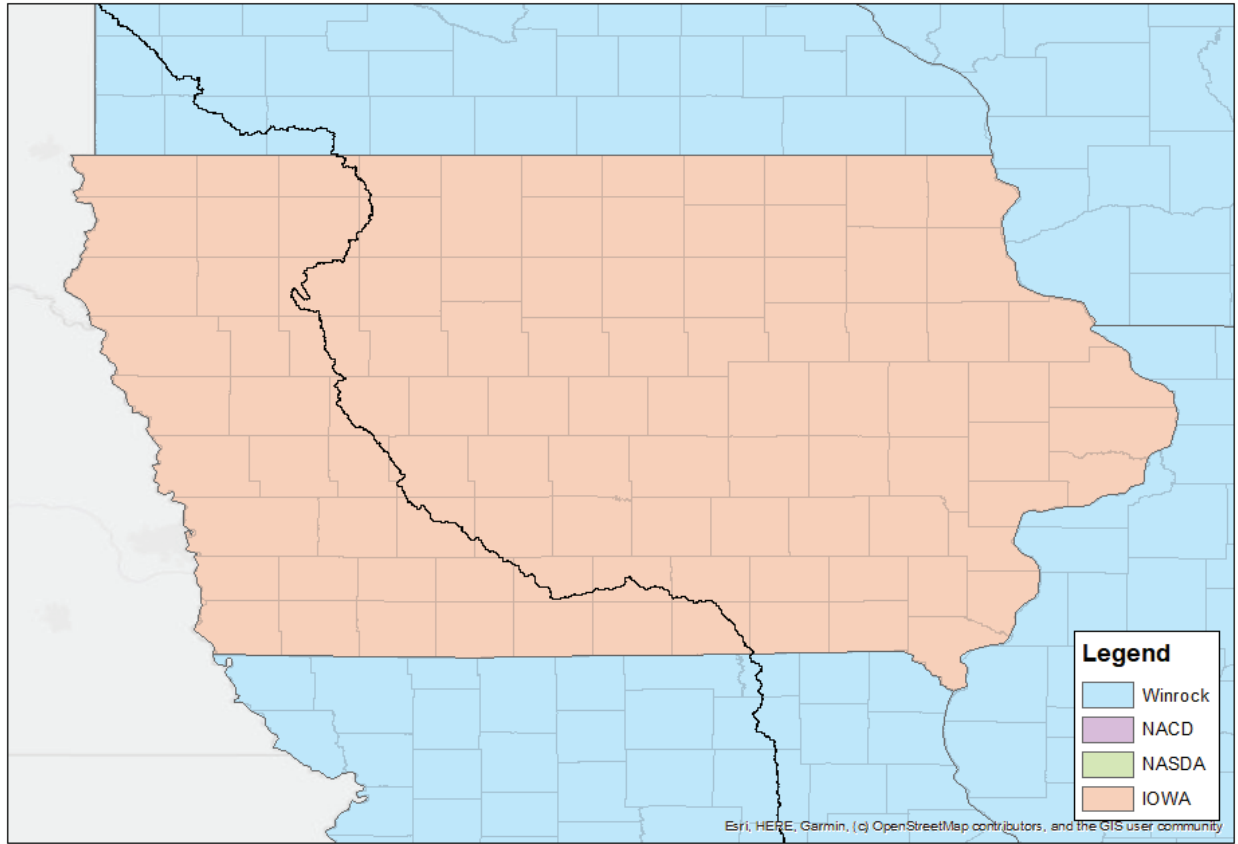

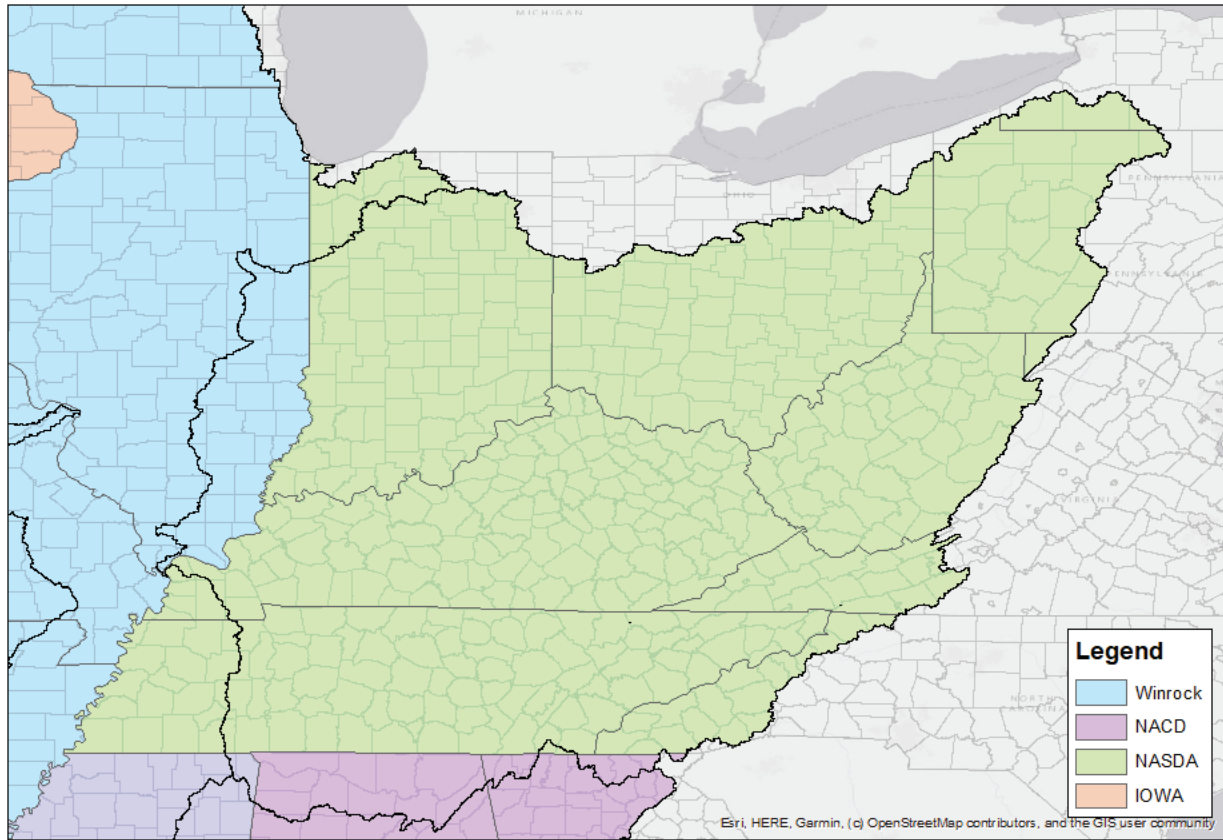

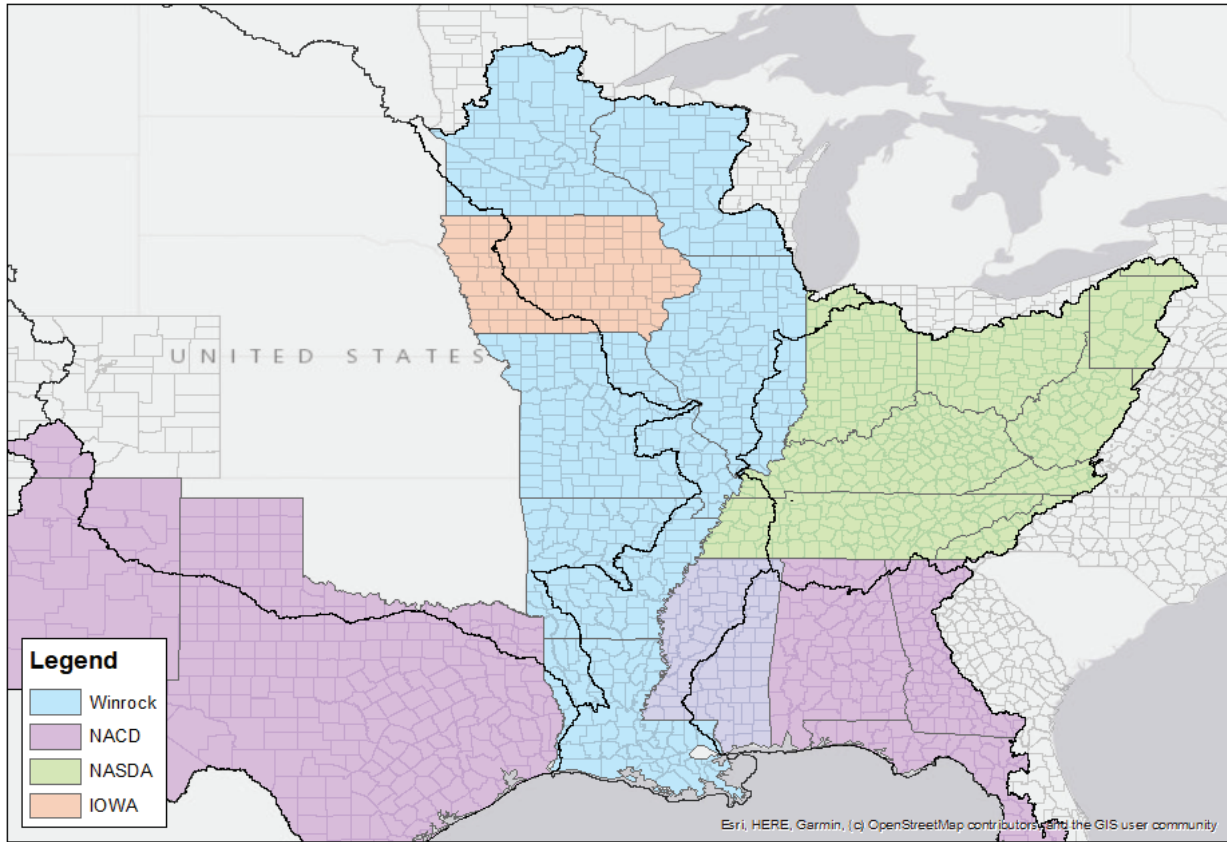
